GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS FOR THE PH.D. IN BASQUE STUDIES

The Center for Basque Studies at the University of Nevada, Reno, has two Graduate Assistantships available from the fall of 2018 and seeks to recruit two well-qualified graduate students for its Tutorial Ph.D. program. The assistantships entail a stipend of \$17,000 on a 10-month contract, as well as health insurance and fee waivers for courses. The program provides students in the humanities and social sciences with an opportunity to pursue doctoral studies emphasizing Basque-related courses and dissertation research. The successful student earns a Doctor of Philosophy in Basque Studies with an emphasis in anthropology, world languages and literatures, geography, political science, or history.

Graduate Assistants work 20 hours per week and pursue their Ph.D. in a dynamic, highly international department with four full-time faculty. The Center is the leading academic and research institution for Basque Studies in the country.

Applicants should hold a Master's degree in any field of the humanities or social sciences. Successful candidates must have strong academic potential.
